### Matthew 18:21-35 The unmerciful servant

We continue our mini-series on Micah 6:8. Last week we looked at acting justly and discovered two powerful words: TSEDEQAH and MISHPAT.

This week we explore the idea of loving mercy. How do we love mercy? What is mercy and why should we love it? There is another beautiful Hebrew word - HESED - that describes God's loving kindness or mercy. What does God's mercy look like and why is it so important for us? All this and more will be uncovered as we learn to "love mercy."

The first in the series of Jez's Level 2 Bible Academy takes place tonight at 6.30pm in the sanctuary.

This course looks at the nature of God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit, the problem of sin, and then looks at some simple doctrines including 'who are the church?'


### The theology of art

The first time we meet God in the story of scripture, we meet Him as an Artist. "Created" is the first verb in the first sentence on the Bible's first page. Out of His imagination, the heavens and the earth burst into existence and teem with diversity and beauty. God could have easily spoken a monochrome cosmos into being. He could have made an all-grey universe filled with grey planets, grey animals, grey-on-grey rainbows in a grey sky. Even oranges would be called "greys" This grey world could've been perfectly efficient and functional from an engineering perspective. Why, then, make our multi-coloured universe? Why create with a colour swatch in hand? Why red strawberries, orange oranges, and yellow bananas? Why mandarin fish, peacocks, and chameleons? Because, as Genesis 1 repeats a fair few times, "God saw that it was good." Evidently, *God cares about more than efficiency and functionality. He also cares about beauty.* 

God made this declaration even before He made Adam and Eve! And as far as I can see, this wasn't a functional 'good' – this was an aesthetically pleasing good! Telling me that something can be truly beautiful even if no human being is around to behold and declaring it to be so. Beauty, then, is not merely something we as humans dream up (though thankfully we can); it's also something

we can discover. We don't fabricate beauty. We find it.

This means when we first beheld the sprawling fuchsia clouds of the Orion Nebula, the cobalt pupil and auburn iris of the Helix Nebula, or the sombre towering gas pillars of the Eagle Nebula, with their speckles of pink fire and wispy sea-green auras, and went WOW, beautiful!! - we did not fabricate this beauty. We found it. They were beautiful long before Hubble left our atmosphere, and they would stay beautiful even if we all went blind tomorrow. We do not hijack the GOD CREATED colours of the rainbow, we merely get to enjoy them when we see their beauty. The Son took on created flesh. He spent most of His career as a craftsman who could make small and large-scale projects with stone, wood, and possibly even metal. Then when His public ministry started, He taught in parables, painting mental pictures that have lived in our imagination for more than two millennia. His greatest commandment to love God with all of ourselves includes the imaginative and creative parts too. Creativity and Christlikeness go hand in hand.

**STARRY STARRY NIGHT?** On Tuesday morning (26<sup>th</sup> March) while listening

to Thought for The Day during Radio 4's morning Today programme <u>Thought for the Day - Tim</u> <u>Stanley - BBC Sounds</u> I heard an interesting piece about Vincent Van Gogh by the historian Tim Stanley. This was to commemorate the painter's birthday and I highly recommend you listen to it. He describes visiting the Van Gogh art museum in Amsterdam (something I have also done and enjoyed) and being impressed by seeing the artist's paintings for the first time in relation to his psychological state and religious beliefs, and how the paintings reflected that as they progressed during his poor, troubled and sad short life.



In particular, he picked out a small 'Pieta' that Van Gogh painted shortly before he died, inspired by

Delacroix's Pieta but, poignantly, using Van Gogh's idiosyncratic use of vivid primary colours and 'wavy' style <u>Vincent van Gogh - Pietà (after Delacroix) - Van</u> <u>Gogh Museum</u>. The pieta is pertinent for 2 reasons;

a. Van Gogh's use of colour to accentuate the meaning. For him it was a way to get at a deeper eternal truth, in this case of faith, just as medieval painters used halos for that purpose.



b. The Christ in Mary's arms has red hair and a beard with a face resembling Van Gogh's, suggesting he identified with the suffering Christ, showing his faith and the inner struggles he was experiencing (he died shortly after, probably at his own hand).

It reminded me of another famous artist who produced a few Pietas which also reflected his attitude and beliefs at different times of his life. Michelangelo Buonorotti (1475-1564) sculpted his first Pieta for St Peter's Church, Rome in 1498. When someone suggested it was done by someone else the young, proud artist was so offended he crept into the church at night and carved his name on the sash across Mary's breast. Fast forward about 50 years after he had some spiritual awakening through his contact with Vittoria Colonna, an Italian Noblewoman influenced by the Reformation, and evidenced in his diary and letters, we find him working on his Florence and Milan Pietas. <u>Michelangelo's Florentine Pieta (1547-53) | EPPH | Art's Masterpieces Explained (everypainterpaintshimself.com)</u> They depict a dead Jesus in the arms of Nicodemus and Mary after they had taken Him down from the cross. Michelangelo put his own sad face on Nicodemus and it appears his humanistic pride had waned and he was also identifying with his belief in the Son Of God who had died to take away his and our sins.

So next time you see these works of art don't just pass them by without thoughtjust looking - but consider the back story and how our beliefs express themselves in art. In particular, as we consider Easter, take another 'good long look' at these two artist's works and may they help you to see its meaning in a fresh way.
