

FILM Review by John Demetriou

Director: Martin Scorsese.

Starring: Leonardo DiCaprio, Robert De Niro, Lily Gladstone NB this article contains spoilers!

This is film making at its finest; taking a little known historical tragedy and faithfully bringing it to public attention using all the resources of good story telling and cinematography to get its message across, touching on Biblical truths in the process.

Scorsese's film deals with the Osage Nation tribe who were moved by the US government from their ancestral homeland to what appeared to be land of little value in

Oklahoma at the end of the nineteenth century. It so happened though, that there was a lot of oil beneath that land and its discovery in the early twentieth century made the Osage Nation some of the wealthiest people in the country per capita.

Unfortunately, where there is a lot of money, greed, covetousness, prejudice, hypocrisy, deceit and murder follow and that is what the film depicts. It focuses on a spate of Osage murders that occurred in the 1920's, centring on one particular family of four sisters. The murders were not properly investigated by corrupt local officials, allowing the guilty to stay free till federal agents (forerunners of the FBI) turned up to undertake a more thorough investigation, arrest and help convict the perpetrators.

The film is a thoughtful study of evil in all its nefarious forms, where local cattle baron William 'King' Hale (played by De Niro), like Shakespeare's Richard III, 'Can smile and murder while he smiles.' He manipulates his impressionable nephew Ernest Burkhardt (DiCaprio) recently returned from the First World War who 'loves money and women' to marry Mollie (played by Lily Gladstone), one of the four Osage sisters, to get her oil money and do other heinous deeds in the process. All this, while Hale conveys himself publicly as the Osage people's best friend.

The story cleverly intertwines different film genres - western, gangster, thriller, whodunnit, romance, historical drama - to weave its tale. It fills in the back story through clever means, e.g. by Ernest reading a history book about the Osage, and old black and white film reels, subtly dripping hints of what is really occurring or fore-shadowing what is to come, building the tension and keeping the audience engaged through the film's three and a half hours.

The acting is masterful, not only by the main characters but also by the minor ones whose performances are all memorable.

The cinematography and music are also of a high standard in keeping with the tone of the film. At times, depicting the vastness of the landscape, the big changes in society at the time, and at others showing intimate close ups of people and the detail inside their homes or the Osage customs. In one memorable scene, 'King' Hale's land is on fire, a scam to claim the insurance money, and the camera lingers over those putting it out in the dark, making them shimmer among the flames like a scene from hell in Dante's Inferno, to capture the sombre mood.

The film's ending is deft and surprising, depicting a radio show before a live audience, dramatising how the FBI solved 'The Osage Murders'. As it concludes, a grey haired man, played significantly by Scorsese himself, comes to the microphone. There is no background music or corny radio sound effects as previously and he pauses for effect before recounting what happened to the main characters after the investigation and especially Molly to show her worth. The film then switches to an aerial view of the Osage performing a tribal ceremony to show their ongoing value also.

I would not be surprised if the film receives numerous awards in different categories, such is the excellence of the film craft here. Regardless of that though, Scorsese is to be commended for highlighting, in a sober and moving way, the truth found in Scripture that, 'The love of money is a root of ALL KINDS OF EVIL' (1Tim. 6:10) and one we all need to be on our guard against to avoid its pitfalls.

Brian's Bulgarian Diary

Mon 6th Nov

Yesterday's service at the local Evangelical Church went well. I was asked to preach following the communion part of the service which took place half way through proceedings. The congregation are now well settled into their new building and have completed works in one area which was not available to them until now. Numbers are on the increase and it is good to see some families with children in attendance. My interpreter, Stefan,



commented afterwards that it is relatively easy for him to translate for me, which meant for a seamless sermon!

As ever, the worship group led the musical parts of the service sensitively and although we didn't know any of the songs this time, we did conclude with "These are the days of Elijah..." and so could join in with the English sub titles!

This week will draw my time in BG to a conclusion. There is the evening service on Tuesday, a bible Study at the Baptist church on Wednesday and a meeting with newly-weds Danny and Sisi in Sofia on Thursday before we catch a 21.00 flight home to LGW.

Wed 8th Nov

Yesterday evening saw me speaking for the final time at the Evangelical Church, this time with a short overview of the Kings of the Bible (not all 40+ of them!) but Saul, Ishbosheth, David and Solomon culminating in the King long-promised, King Jesus. There's a tremendous amount we can learn from these four particularly, not least drawing the comparison in the life of David when he "enquired of the Lord and met with success and other occasions when he failed to do this and met with disaster.

This evening we went to the Baptist Church for their evening service. This time I shared with them from Psalm 116: 15: "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his saints," sharing with them how helpful we had found this verse when adjusting to life following Mum's recent "home call". The congregation were most appreciative, not least as death is often a topic not readily mentioned here (as elsewhere).

Tomorrow we journey by car to Sofia (about 3 hour trip). Our return flight is at 21.00 hours (local time), arriving at LGW at 22.30 (BST time). (Thursday evening)

Prayer Diary 13TH - 19TH November

'The Lord himself goes before you and will be with you; do not be afraid; do not be discouraged'. Deuteronomy 31:8.

Monday. For your prayers think about community rooms that help keep people warm which are opening or have opened again this year for winter. Pray that people in need will seek out these spaces and that there will be kind words and support for them there.

Tuesday. Pray for those who are seeking a church to attend, that they will find a 'home' amongst fellow believers in which they feel they belong.

Wednesday. Bring to God those who once had a strong faith in Him and now are struggling with their Christian walk, that they might find clarity in their belief in God and be strengthened and renewed.

Thursday. Think about people and communities that have been affected by the recent floodings and how it has impacted their homes and businesses, which might continue for some time. Ask God to help them as they move forward in their lives.

Friday. In your prayer time, think about families displaced due to war and natural disasters. As we sit in our homes remember them as they live in refugee camps, without home comforts and basic amenities that we often take for granted.

Saturday. Let us persist in prayer for loved ones who do not know the Lord, that they too will know Jesus in a personal and real way.

Sunday. Thank God for the changing of the seasons, for the colours autumn brings. Remember that as the weather cools, illnesses increase and put added pressure onto our medical services. Pray for all those who work in hospital settings.
