

Prayer Diary: 15TH - 20TH December



This week's prayers focus on Advent; a time of waiting and promise, and a time to reflect on hope, peace, joy and love.

HOPE "...but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint." Isaiah 40:31 We thank You, Lord, for the hope we have in You. An eternal hope that is not based on earthly desires, but on Your Word and Your promises. We ask You to fill us with Your hope and strength when we feel lost or weak. Help us to focus on You in times of need and to remember Your promise never to leave us. Pray for those who are living without this hope - for friends, neighbours and prodigals; for those who are placing their hope in temporary solutions. Pray that they will discover the only true hope that is in Jesus Christ.

PEACE "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." John 14:27 This world is very troubled, with international conflicts, national division and family breakdown. Thank God that, even in the most difficult of circumstances, we have the peace of Christ. Pray for peace in war-torn areas such as Ukraine, Gaza, Yemen and Sudan. Ask God to intervene and protect His Church in these areas. Remember our church family in Lebedyn and the persecuted church in Nigeria and other parts of the world. Bring political leaders before God and ask Him to give them wisdom.

JOY "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice!" Philippians 4:4

The New Testament reminds us that Paul always found joy in any circumstance. Pray that God will help you to do the same. This joy comes from a deep assurance of our salvation and is not dependent on our circumstance. Take some time to praise God and thank Him for all that He has done for you, and especially for sending His Son Jesus. Pray for those who are struggling to find joy at this time. Those who are grieving, seriously ill, or struggling with debt or with relationship issues.

LOVE "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." John 3:16

Praise God for the depth of His love for us in sending Jesus. Ask that His love will shine in our hearts and that our actions will always be loving and be an expression of His love. Pray that the true message of Christmas and God's great love for humanity will be like a light shining in the darkness. Ask God to bless the ministry of VBC this Christmas so that many will come to know the true hope, peace, joy and love of God this Christmas.

CHRISTMAS CHALLENGE

One of our members has suggested that we all take up the challenge this year of inviting at least one friend, neighbour or work colleague to come with them to this year's *Carols by Candlelight*. Even if only 25% of the congregation did this, we'd probably be packed out and facing a "standing room only" scenario! To give you an idea of figures the attendance at last year's *C by C* saw an increase of 21% attending compared to 2023. If we had a similar increase this year we would certainly need an overflow facility so let's plan in advance for such a situation and start inviting others along.

When you go out of your way to invite a friend, neighbour, or work colleague, invariably they're happy to come along — and in some cases, it's just the nudge they need!




BIBLE Reading notes

"The LORD is a refuge for the oppressed, a stronghold in times of trouble. Those who know Your name will trust in You, for You, LORD, have never forsaken those who seek You" Psalm 9:9,10

Someone told me that she had been going through a difficult time – her daughter went into hospital for an operation, her father was in hospital many miles away, there was something wrong with the car and there were various other problems to face.

Sometimes we go through times in our life when it seems that everything is against us. There can be various reasons for this happening. It may be that we are being oppressed by Satan, or that God is seeking to discipline us because He sees various things in our life that are displeasing to Him, or we may have wandered away from the Lord and He is seeking to stop us in our

tracks in order that we turn back to Him.

Whatever happens to us, and for whatever reason, God is watching over us and He sees how we react. Often we resent adverse circumstances and we become angry - with what is happening, with ourselves, and maybe,



even with God. But all the time God is reaching out to us, longing for us to seek Him afresh, to trust Him, to seek refuge in Him, to know His presence with us no matter what problems we are facing.

Those who know the name of Jesus - who know that He is their Saviour and Lord - will find that they can trust Him no matter what happens. Whatever our circumstances, may our response be, "I will trust and not be afraid."
