# Prayer Diary: 15<sup>TH</sup> - 21<sup>ST</sup> September

"The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and discipline." Proverbs 1:7

Proverbs is not a book I have ever heard preached on but it is an interesting read. Most of the book was written by Solomon and we will focus this week's prayers around the main five themes of proverbs. A proverb is a short concise sentence that conveys a moral truth.

Monday As we all know, since about the mid 1960's, schools and universities have increasingly taught knowledge without faith. Heavenly Father, we pray that people working in our education system will have their eyes opened by You to see the difference between knowledge and wisdom, that is, applying the facts we learn to life. We pray for a reintroduction of Christian principles in all schools that will enable pupils to find faith, teach them to attain wisdom and discipline, and learn how to do what is right, just and fair. We pray for divine wisdom in all daily life for the benefit and blessing of all humanity.

**Tuesday** <u>Wisdom</u>. Let's pray into the words of Proverbs 2:1-5. *My son, if you accept my words and store up my commands within you,...* Lord, help us to be fully devoted to accepting the truths in the Bible, remembering Your commands. Help us to seek wisdom and understanding and insight. We rededicate ourselves to choosing Your way, we want to know and love You more.

**Wednesday** Relationships. Proverbs 11:14 For lack of guidance a nation falls... 11;16 A kind hearted woman gains respect but ruthless men gain only wealth. 11:5 The righteousness of the blameless makes a straight way for them. Father God, in every relationship with friends, family and colleagues help us to show love, dedication and high moral standards. Help us to use the wisdom You give us as we care for those around us as our act of service to You.

**Thursday** Speech. Proverbs 4:24 *Put away perversity from your mouth, keep corrupt talk far from your lips.* 10:31 *The mouth of the righteousness brings forth wisdom.* 25:11 *A word aptly spoken is like apples of gold in settings of silver.* The bible shows us how important speech is for our benefit and for the benefit of the hearer. Lord, we pray that You will give us self-control in speech because we know that our words show our real attitude towards others and reveal what we are really like; our speech is a test of how wise we have become.

**Friday** Work. Proverbs 4:24 diligent hands will rule. 10:31 *A generous man will himself be blessed for he shares his food with the poor.* Father God, we pray that You will control the final outcome of our work according to Your will, work which You have prepared for each of us to do. However menial or unglamorous the work You have given us may be, help us to work as if we were doing our job for Christ Himself. May we willingly serve knowing we are Your hands on earth.

**Saturday** Success. Proverbs 22:6 *Train a child in the way he should go and when he is old he will not turn from it*. We pray that You, God, will bless the spiritual devotion of our volunteer Sunday school teachers, and for Emily and Simon, as they use their time, talent and resources wisely in Your service and help them to always give You the glory. And for those of us who now have grown up children who at present have not committed their lives to You, give us faith and patience as we pray and trust in the promise of Proverbs 22:6

**Sunday** The word proverb means to govern, Heavenly Father help us to find time in our already packed schedules to not only read the book of Proverbs, but also to act on it. As we learn from Your word, we pray that our joy will increase, as we understand more and more that knowing God is the key to wisdom. Amen.

May God watch over and bless us all this week with His perfect peace, in Jesus' name.

# **BSL**

When deafened friends died who had used lip-reading in communication with me, the Lord challenged me with Romans 10:13-15. In the middle of that short passage we are asked "...how can they hear without someone preaching to them?" His challenge set me on a path to gain understanding of the Deaf, and deafened communities, because most cannot "hear" and use a visual



language instead, called British Sign Language, or BSL. I wonder if you know that there is no church that is currently accessible to those who use BSL in East Sussex?

We had a conference in 2017 at VBC, and I learned a lot about those born Deaf and how discouraged they felt over the lack of accessibility at church events. This is because they are losing their hearing, and the reasonable adjustments provided in law, are not automatically provided in places of worship, so they just quietly disappear from meetings and no one seems to be troubled by their not attending or silent distress.

Sign language is a visual language that those born Deaf use, and those with hearing loss, and their loved ones, can learn to maintain a method of communication. Some of us at Victoria have learned the first level, so we could communicate a tiny bit with anyone from the Deaf community. They would then not feel so isolated. Some of you will be aware that we have a table during Flow Cafe where BSL is used.

Part of my recent re-commissioning, when I had been discouraged at the lack of progress, has been the affirmation of the verses in Romans, and the opportunity to attend a Level 2 BSL course at East Sussex College after 7 years of waiting. We are still hoping, praying and working towards churches welcoming members of the Deaf community to SEE the gospel, and become followers of Jesus. If you might be interested in the language, there are opportunities to learn at the

college, but this short course might be an opportunity to explore this beautiful, graphic language too, especially if you have hearing loss, or have loved ones who are being deafoned.

Please can I ask you to remember in prayer the needs of Deaf people to be reached with the good news about Jesus, and to pray this will be accomplished before too long. Please pray that I might grasp and remember all that I will learn,


with the confidence to use it more as it takes longer to achieve this in our senior years.

# THE CAP 'VISIT Team' a FLEXIBLE, OCCASIONAL VOLUNTEERING OPPORTUNITY

It takes a team of people to make our CAP debt centre ministry a success and we currently have an opportunity for a few more men and women to join our 'Visit Team'. For each home visit to clients that Nadine and I undertake as debt coaches, we aim to have a volunteer accompany us to assist us and support the client so as to make the visit as beneficial as possible. Visits can last from 30 minutes to a couple of hours depending on the need, and



are all in the Eastbourne district. You won't have to answer any questions about debt or finances as Nadine and I will deal with all those aspects.

Who would make a good member of the visit team? This role would suit someone with good relationship-building skills, an open and completely non-judgmental nature (and not easily shocked), an ability to maintain confidentiality, and a heart and resilience to serve. Team members need to be Christians with daytime availability and who understand that clients don't always keep appointments and that it is part of the role to be patient and understanding. There are also likely to be opportunities to share something of your own faith or experience of God in your life, in a way that is sensitive to the client's situation, and to pray with clients if they so wish.

# Jo Brunson

I was brought up in a Christian family in a local village attending a church in Uckfield each Sunday. At the age of 11 I spoke with one of the church leaders about what it was to be a Christian. Later that day, while on a walk across our fields with my dad, I gave my life to Jesus. Through my teenage years I enjoyed attending Christian summer camps and later joined the organising committee, whilst continuing to support children's summer holiday clubs and youth groups.

When I was at university, I was diagnosed with Hodgkins Lymphoma and although this brought about

challenges in completing my teaching degree, I always felt that God had a plan for me and was very close by my side. I was able to continue with my course alongside the chemotherapy, qualifying as a primary school teacher just a few months later.

In 2003, Dave and I were married at VBC before moving away from Sussex.

Over those years I have been blessed to be able to help in other churches with designing and managing a church website, leading all-age, family and reflective church services and being on a committee for selecting a new pastor.

Since returning to VBC with our three children, I have felt thankful to God for the care, support and love shown to our family. We very quickly settled and felt at home. Over recent months I have felt God prompting me to take on more of a role in the life of the church and I feel I could serve Him and the church in this way.

# **Deirdre Dean**

I spent my childhood and early teens in Rhodesia, now known as Zimbabwe, where I was born.. My grandparents were missionaries and I was so privileged to be born into a loving Christian family and to be baptised by my grandfather at the age of 11.

My family came to the UK when I was 14 and we settled in Fife, Scotland. I went to Surrey University, enjoyed a wonderful career in hotel management and met my husband Christopher in

London where we were both working. We emigrated to Canada where we spent eight years and where all our three children were born.

After we returned to the UK we spent a couple of years in Scotland and then found ourselves in Eastbourne. I became Chief Executive of Eastbourne Blind Society and after some years in hotels, Christopher became Administrator at Victoria.


We became members of Victoria Baptist Church over 30 years ago. I taught Sunday School for many years and was part of the team that started the Monday Vicky Bees group, seeing numbers grow from eight children to 55 at one point! I was also part of the BUGZ team - a monthly Saturday morning group for 8 to 11 year olds.

A number of us felt passionately at the time that we needed to nurture our young people and children and it was an answer to much prayer when Victoria appointed its first youth leader.

I have served on the pastoral team, and continue to be part of the welcome team, flower ministry and the worship group. I have led a Life Group for about 20 years. In retirement, I have become part of the team at Linking Lives which is a Christian charity whose aims are to match older people experiencing loneliness with volunteers from Eastbourne churches.

Serving on the CLT has been mentioned to me in previous years, but this year I felt God calling me to it and in obedience to that I'm standing for nomination.
