MATTHEW 8:18-22

The Essential Jesus – Foxes and Funerals

“Foxes have holes, birds of the air have nests but the Son of Man has no place to lay His head.” (Matt. 8:20)

Jesus hardly ever gives the answers we expect Him to give. We expect certain answers because we see the world in a certain way. He gives different answers because He sees the world in a different way. The key to wisdom and insight for us is to see the world through the eyes of Jesus.

In the passage we’re looking at this week, two men approach Jesus with discipleship on their minds. One offers to leave everything, the other to do the same after fulfilling the most sacred obligation. Jesus responds to them both in ways that seem very strange.

To the first He points to foxes; to the second He talks about funerals. The first shows us the cost of following Jesus, the second the value of following Him. Let’s pray that, as we consider these things together, God would open our eyes to see the world as Jesus sees it.

PRAYER DIARY 18TH - 24TH SEPTEMBER

Monday Proverbs 22:6 “Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it.” Let us spend time praying for Christian parents to have God’s wisdom and guidance to train up their children in His ways. Today, everything in education and the world around them is trying hard to direct the children in the opposite direction - parents need us to pray for them.

Tuesday Psalm 12 seems to describe the days in which we live in many respects but we can be thankful for those who choose to lead Godly lives and encourage the younger generations to read, meditate on, and learn the words of God. Let us pray for Erik, Simon and all those who volunteer to spend time encouraging the children and young people connected with VBC to read, learn and meditate in The Bible. We also need to pray for more volunteers as the need is increasing. (KJV Psalm 12:6-7)

Wednesday Psalm 145:4 “One generation commends Your works to another; they tell of Your mighty acts.” Usually, this verse makes us think of older generations sharing with younger ones. However, if you were at the recent baptismal service, Max and Charlotte certainly declared God’s mighty works experienced already in their lives, as did Janet too. Please pray for them, for God’s protection, guidance and blessing as they continue in their new lives of love and obedience to Him after the joyous occasion of their baptisms.

Thursday Isaiah 46:4 “... Even to your old age and grey hairs I am He, I am He who will sustain you, - In Romans we are told we are grafted into God’s chosen people when we trust in Jesus as our Saviour, so this wonderful promise in Isaiah is for those who are older. Like Janet, we can choose to listen to God’s voice, believe what He says to us and be obedient. So today, please pray for all who are in what you might call the older generations, asking that they will know that God knows them by name, sustains, carries and, where needed, rescues them. They are not forgotten but are valued by our heavenly Father and, in obedience, can contribute to the work of His kingdom, in active ways, or by prayer.

Friday John 2: ‘Do whatever He (Jesus) tells you.’ One of the greatest gifts God has given us is free will to choose. Even as believers we choose whether we obey Him or not, and choose whether we serve Him or not every day in every generation. There is no redundancy, nor retirement in our Heavenly Father’s Kingdom. So, whichever generation you find yourself in today, what is The Lord asking you to do for Him in a way that extends His Kingdom? Please spend time asking Him that question today to see what He wants you to be involved with for Him.

FUEL FOR PRAYER

Saturday Romans 10:13-14 “for ‘Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.’ How then can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them?” In every generation there are people with hearing loss, and those born deaf. Many people need to ‘see’ these truths not ‘hear’ them. Please pray for all in churches who struggle to hear in services and prayer meetings because of the deterioration of their hearing. Please also pray for the vision for British Sign Language to be used at Victoria Baptist Church in services, Alpha courses and prayer meetings so those born deaf, or deafened, can access the good news about salvation through the person and work of our Lord Jesus.

Sunday Colossians 1: “I have become its (the Church’s) servant by the commission God gave me to present to you the word of God in its fullness – the mystery that has been kept hidden for ages and generations, but is now disclosed to the Lord’s people. To them God has chosen to make known among the Gentiles the glorious riches of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory.” Let us thank God that His truths are now available to all generations in most countries. Please pray for Rev Chris Short and those who have this servant teaching responsibility at Victoria. Ask God to continue teaching and growing them in their faith and understanding of His word. Ask God to protect them, and their families, from all evil. Also, please pray for any you know who are serving in other churches, and for those churches where these “glorious riches” are not being truthfully taught.

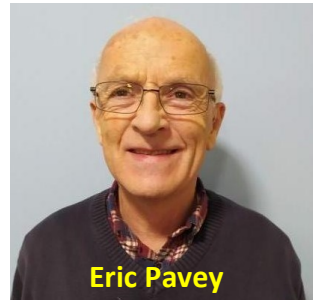


Rooted is a community food project based in Gorrington Road. They deliver food to Community Fridges in Eastbourne, including ours here at VBC.

Keeping the door ajar, I decided to hear him out. Then I thought about the lame beggar at the temple gate. And that's when I got one of those nudges, "Give him what he really needs". So I opened the door wide and the following conversation ensued.

"What's your name?" I ask.

Looking at me a little startled, he replies, "Harry, what's yours?"

"Twenty five".
