





Matthew 7:1-6 - Planks, Pigs & Pearls

"Do not judge, or you too will be judged." (v1)

The above verse is probably the most quoted and misapplied saying of Jesus. Everyone knows that Jesus said, "Do not judge" but not many people know what it means or have considered its context. For many years Christians would have it quoted to them, as a rebuke whenever they wanted to question the decisions and behaviour of others. Sometimes Christians also quoted



it to absolve themselves of the responsibility of saying things that were socially disagreeable.

In the immediate context (see verse 6), and the wider Sermon, it is obvious that Jesus cannot mean we should not exercise any kind of judgment. Indeed, life, love and obedience to God is impossible without the exercise of good judgment. This week we'll look together at what planks, pearls and pigs can teach us about being the people of God.

God's Providence, Revival and our Role



The themes of God's providence, revival and our response ran through the talks and seminars of this year's Bible By The Beach Conference (2nd-5th May), 'In All Things God at Work'. I would like to share some of the teaching to encourage us to have

renewed confidence in our almighty God and learn what our role should be. God's Providence in Nature and Human affairs

The providence of God can be seen in the natural world by the way He maintains it, providing what is necessary for the preservation of life and its well being and the discernible, reliable laws of nature. 'He makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the righteous and unrighteous.' (Matt.5:45)

It is also seen in God's desire to see justice done, 'Shall not the Judge of all the earth do what is just' (Gen.18:24-26), working against evil now, e.g. through 'the authoritiesinstituted by God' (Rom. 13:1), and setting 'a day on which He (God) will judge the world in righteousness' (Acts 17:31) at the end times.

We also see God's providence directed particularly at His chosen people who have believed and trusted in Him and on whom He has set His special love. Of them we read, 'He chose them before the foundation of the world' (Eph.1:4), He adopted them into God's family as sons (Eph.1:5) and has promised, 'all things work together for good, for those called according to His purpose.' (Rom.8:28)

The Mystery and Paradox of God's Sovereignty and Man's Responsibility

The Bible teaches people are responsible and accountable for their actions. Man chose to rebel against God at the beginning, listening to the devil's lies and disobeying God. As a result, 'sin came into the world through **one man** (Adam), and death through sin, and so death spread to **all men** because all sinned.' (Rom.5:12) 'People loved darkness rather than the light, because their deeds were evil.' (Jn.3:19)

Yet God, in His providence, has made a way of escape if people trust in Christ and His work on the cross to find a way back to Him, repair the damage, overcome the devil and restore man to paradise (Col.2:13-15, 2 Peter 3:13). God calls on all people to repent and believe the Gospel (Acts 17:30 and Jn. 3:16).

The problem, though, is we can't believe without His help to open our spiritual eyes as He instructed Nicodemus, 'unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God' (Jn.3:3) or 'open our hearts to pay attention to what is said' as He did for Lydia at Philippi (Acts 16:14). ...

... This brings us to the paradox of salvation where, in God's economy, two seemingly opposite ideas are true and it is a mystery how they work. Our finite minds can't fully comprehend it as Paul declared in Rom. 11:33-35, 'How unsearchable are His judgements and how inscrutable His ways.' Our job as disciples is to believe both and, as Augustine taught, 'pray as if everything depends on God. Work as if everything depends on you.'

The Nuances

The main Bible readings at the conference brought out a third element to these two doctrines of God's providence/sovereignty and man's accountability by pointing out how in practice God's ways are unpredictable, not clear cut but more nuanced than we might think or like them to be, especially for believers at the time they occurred. For example, David's victory over Goliath was humanly unexpected - a superior, well armed, hardened warrior against a teenager armed only with 'a sling and a stone!' Or, in the later story, when Absalom rebelled against King David, Absalom has the retreating king at his mercy but chooses to reject the superior and accredited advice of Ahithophel, listening to Hushai's advice instead, which allowed David to escape, regroup and regain control. The point being made in both cases was that victory was in the balance to the last minute and it is clear that without God's intervention, using 'weak means' to overcome a stronger adversary, it would not have occurred. This reminds us of God's ultimate victory over sin and the devil through the weakness/'foolishness' of the cross and the spread of the gospel through its preaching (1Cor.1:20-25).

Revival and our Part

During the conference we also considered how God's sovereignty/providence and man's role relate to revival, when God moves in a powerful, extraordinary way to

restore and extend His kingdom. We considered what the believer's role is to help facilitate such a movement, taking lessons from previous revivals. The following was suggested:

- a. Humble yourself before God. Ask Him to 'restore and revive us again (Ps. 85:4-6) that we might recapture the joy of the Lord as our first love (1Peter1:8, Rev.2:4-5).
- b. Pray for God to accompany the preached word with the power of the Holy Spirit and full conviction (1Thess.1:5) and for God's work to 'speed ahead and be honoured.' (2Thess.3:1)



c. Confess known sin and receive forgiveness through Christ.

- d. Remove any obstacles that you know hinder your Christian faith and follow the ways of holiness as Job did when he 'made a covenant with his eyes' not to look at a woman lustfully (31:3).
- e. Quick obedience to the Holy Spirit's promptings in your life, in line with his Word (Phil.2:13)
- f. Readiness to confess Christ where appropriate and 'prepared to give the reason for the hope that you have.' (1Peter1:13)

We can't force a revival but by following the above we are better prepared when it comes, more likely for God to use us in one and it will 'keep us from being ineffective or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ'. (2 Peter1:8)
