# You're Gonna Have to Serve Somebody - Romans 6:15-23

"But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves to God, the benefit you reap leads to holiness, and the result is eternal life."

(Romans 6:22)

There's an old Bob Dylan song that starts like this:

"You may be an ambassador to England or France
You may like to gamble, you might like to dance
You may be the heavyweight champion of the world
You may be a socialite with a long string of pearls.

But you're gonna have to serve somebody,

Yes, indeed you're gonna have to serve somebody.

It may be the devil, or it may be the Lord,

But you're gonna have to serve somebody."

That idea comes straight from the passage we're looking at this weekend. Paul's remarkable insight in Romans 6:15-23 is that whatever we choose to pursue in our lives always end up controlling our lives.

Ultimately there are only two masters to choose between - God or not-God. If God is our master, sin is not. If God is not our master, whatever else is, leads to slavery, disappointment and ultimately death.

As we look at this passage together we'll see that the gospel is concerned with more than mere forgiveness (as wonderful as that is) but produces a whole new life in the joyful, obedient service of a new and wonderful master.

Genesis 1:27 (NIV)

This week in our afternoon service, we will be focusing on the key question: **How should we see the unbelievers around us?** 

This session aims to help us to view unbelievers the way God sees them - made in His image, under His wrath but not beyond His grace.

There will be a video presentation and time for discussion and prayer. We hope that as many of you as possible will be able to join us. Those who have been able to attend so far have expressed how useful these sessions are.

If you are unable to make it this week, then here is a link to the video and a few questions for you to consider once you have watched it. Maybe you could discuss the questions with others.

- Do we really see people as made in God's image, precious to Him? How can we grow in remembering this truth and relating to people accordingly?
- Do we really see people as coming under God's wrath? How does this impact our desire to share the gospel?
- How does the truth that no one is beyond the reach of God's grace affect how we relate to others?
- How could you show people practically that you see them how God sees them?

Finally, spend some time in prayer:

Praise God that we are made in His image and saved by His grace through Jesus. Ask forgiveness for our tendency not to see people the way He does. Ask God to draw people to you and help you to lovingly connect and journey with them towards life in Jesus.

#### FareShare Sussex

Old Town Community Fridge has recently joined the FareShare Sussex family. Based in Eastbourne, they are tackling food waste and reducing food poverty. Jo and Anna from FareShare Sussex delivered their first load of surplus food on October 11th. They were welcomed by Sandra Taylor, co-founder of the project, who works at Victoria Baptist Church, where the fridge is located. A couple of days later we had a chat with Helen Diplock, co



-founder of the project alongside Sandra, about their new Community Fridge. Helen explained to us that the initiative was officially launched on October 13th. However, they actually started providing food earlier than that in response to a community drive to tackle food waste and fight food poverty. Old Town has hidden pockets of deprivation and is also home to many people who care for the environment and want to reduce their carbon footprint by stopping food from going to waste. Putting these two together was a natural way to solve two separate social problems.

With the help of the Old Town Borough Councillors, who part-funded the fridge, and the help of volunteers from The Old Town Eastbourne Salvation Army, this Community Fridge already is very well used. Every Wednesday morning, between 30 to 40 people go there to collect their food. A third of them are in food poverty,



another third are on a low income and the other third are people wishing to reduce food waste. Helen told us that at the beginning they were able to rely on the support of their local collect network to surplus food. community fridges, including projects that FareShare Sussex provides food for Eastbourne, shared and passed on what little they had leftover. However, this wasn't enough and did not meet the immediate demand. Helen

explains: "If you have a certain amount of food, people come and see what you have. They become confident in visiting you. If they know there's not much food, they are not incentivized to come."

Helen and Sandra are grateful for the help and support of local businesses such as Everything Spice, supplied by Poppyseed Bakery, on Albert Parade. Now, being in receipt of regular food from FareShare Sussex, they are guaranteed stability and sustainability. ...

... Helen says "Having that guaranteed delivery of food from FareShare has made a huge difference - knowing that we will have a good supply of food each week has given us and our customers confidence". It was inspiring to hear the passion and drive from Helen's words. She sees the Old Town Community Fridge as a place to have a chat whilst sharing recipes and laughter, ultimately reducing social isolation. Helen talked about a beneficiary who visited with her daughter — while she was shopping the child was occupied playing games with others in a safe space.

Helen and Sandra are working to provide a safe and warm space that welcomes everyone. They are already planning a new coffee area where people without much money can enjoy a sociable drink with one another.

## **COMMUNITY OUTREACH**

In October we were approached by the Well-being and Lifestyle coordinator at The Hawthorns, Independent Living Centre in Carew Road, asking if the church would be able to provide a Sunday service for them. There are one hundred residents at The Hawthorns. So this is a great opportunity for community outreach.



It is proposed that we offer a service

on a Sunday, once a month, between 4.30pm and 6.00pm. The service to last no more than 45 minutes.

The CLT have asked me to take this forward. We need to build a team of people who would be willing to take a turn at running a service so that nobody is committed to being available every time. Each service would need three people, plus a keyboard player. So, I am asking for volunteers please. If you feel this is something you could help with please be in touch with me. Perhaps some of the Life groups could take a turn at providing the service? If your Life group could help please let me know. If we get a good number of volunteers I envisage no-one would need to commit to more than twice a year.

Depending on volunteers and availability we may be able to do a 'one-off' before Christmas for them and then start properly in 2022.


## **AUTHENTIC CHRISTIANITY**

written by Dr. Martin Lloyd-Jones, and reviewed by John Demetriou

As we go through the book of Romans on Sunday mornings, the Passion for Life evangelism course in the afternoons and run an alpha course at Victoria it is helpful to have something substantial to read to compliment them. This book does that by taking some of the great fundamental doctrines Paul covers and applying them to our witness in the present world with its challenges.



The book comprises twenty evangelistic sermons given by Dr Martyn Lloyd-Jones from 1966-7, expounding Stephen's sermon and defence of Christianity against the accusations of blasphemy brought by the Jewish Leaders in the book of Acts Chapter 7. It is of particular interest because it is one of the longest and most complete expositions and defence of the Christian position we have in the New Testament. On first glance it appears to have little relevance to Christianity because of its preoccupation with detailed Jewish history but Llyod-Jones shows there is more to it than that. Stephen was a remarkable man 'full of God's grace and power' and not only did he do 'great wonders and miraculous signs' but was gifted with



great 'wisdom'. What he does here is to set out a carefully thought-out and reasoned argument to show his accusers how mistaken they were and their need to re-evaluate their history to see God's bigger plan of salvation and what their response should be. In doing this Lloyd-Jones points out how, similar to Paul at the beginning of the book of Romans, Stephen starts with Abraham before the Jewish nation existed and therefore his message has relevance to the non Jew and us as well.

The style of the book is someone addressing you directly and personally, as all of Lloyd-Jones books are, because they are verbatim records of his sermons. This gives them a distinctive and emotional intimacy as if you were sitting in

his church at Westminster Chapel in London listening and being stirred by his powerful reasoning, persuasion and entreaty to the mixed congregation of believers and non believers in the congregation as he confronts the common arguments against Christianity using lessons from history, experience and especially the Bible in drawing out lessons from Stephen's address.

Why should you read this book in your busy lives? It will inspire and help you to appreciate your privileged position in the Christian faith, help renew your thinking and life along Biblical lines as well as 'prepare you to give an answer for the ... 10

... hope that you have' and how to 'defend and confirm the gospel' when required which is a ministry we are all called to as believers.

The situation in the world today is not so different from sixty years ago, if anything it is worse, and the Christian response and message is still the same and just as relevant and needful, if not more so. I encourage you to take the time and effort to read this book to keep your faith robust, authentic and help provide you with the right mind set to be an effective witness for our times. It would also make a great Christmas present.
