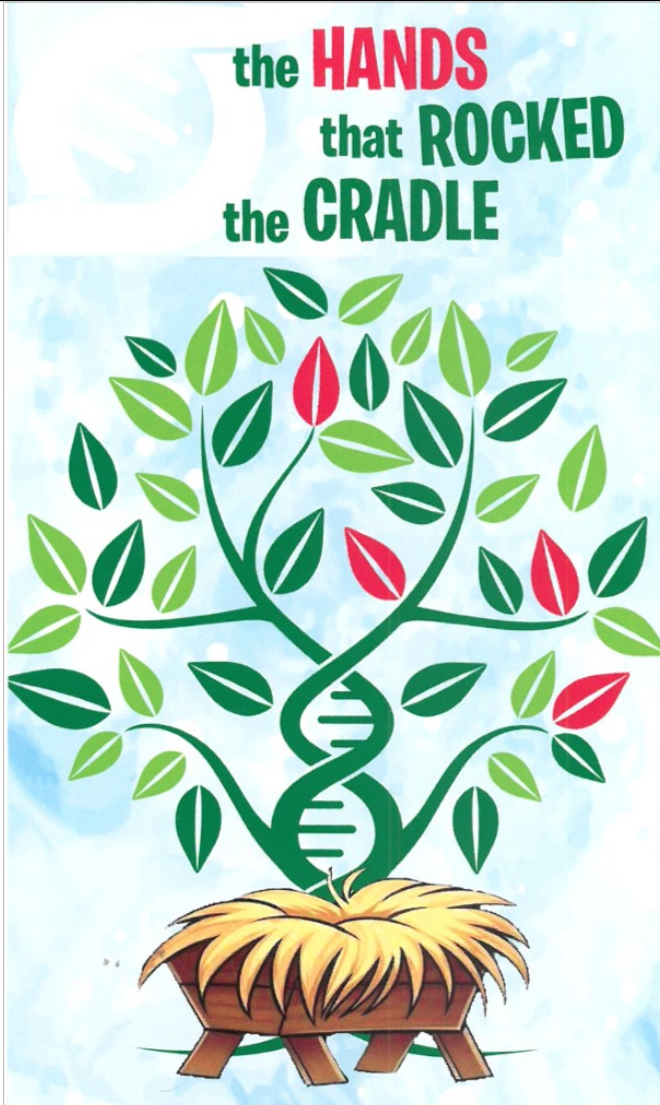

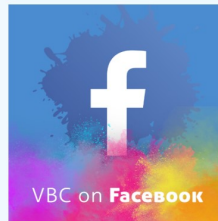

The Hands That Rocked the Cradle – Tamar

Matt. 1:1-6 / Gen. 38:1-7, 11-26 –

“Judah recognised them and said, “She is more righteous than I...” (Gen. 38:26)

Although it is not the first Sunday of advent until next week, this week commences our Christmas Series. The New Testament begins with the genealogy of Jesus. Matthew traces the genealogy of Jesus from Abraham to David, from David to the exile, and from the exile to Joseph, “the husband of Mary who was the mother of Jesus, who is called the Messiah.” (Matt. 1:16).

A strange fact about this genealogy is the number of women named in it. Strictly speaking, none of them are necessary to get from Abraham to Joseph but Matthew includes a number of female names, in addition to Mary at the end - Tamar, Rahab, Ruth and Uriah’s wife (Bathsheba). Why does he do that? Apart from Ruth, it can hardly be for their virtue!

This Christmas, God willing, we’ll consider why each of them is important and how they illuminate the plan of salvation that has come to its head in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. This week, we’ll begin with Tamar and see how grace breaks in to even the darkest places and can soften even the hardest hearts.

- Only post cards to members of the church or to regular attenders
- No cards to be posted to people who have moved on to another church or to another part of the country - these will not be delivered I'm afraid
- When posting your cards, please bunch them (elastic bands will be available on top of the postbox) and arrange them alphabetically (by surname)



- Please make a donation in lieu of postage, using the envelopes on top of the post box if paying by cash or cheque. Alternatively, we may be able to use the card machine if you want to pay by card - or use the church's bank details (with a reference of Christmas Post) if you are paying by bank transfer.

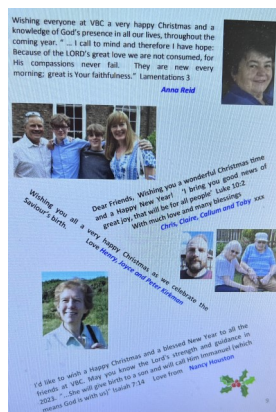
All proceeds will once again be shared between Community Fridge and CAP.

PRAYER DIARY 27TH Nov - 3RD Dec

MONDAY *"The elders who direct the affairs of the church well are worthy of double honour, especially those whose work is preaching and teaching."* 1Tim 5:17. Remember all who were involved in ministry yesterday and pray that those of us who were hearers will take the message we heard to heart. Pray for all involved in ministry of the Word next Sunday, the beginning of Advent, as they begin preparation. Remember Erik as he returns to the UK and commit those with whom he has ministered to the Lord.

TUESDAY *"Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, watching over them – not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be..."* 1Peter5:2. Remember those who have been commissioned from VBC to minister elsewhere - Bayo and Deneese in Battersea; Emma as she serves in Gosport; Darren and Emily, newly settled in Lymington. Remember also Neil and Jess in Moulsecoomb, Brighton, and Carl and Chrissie in Sovereign Harbour.

WEDNESDAY *"Keep watch over all your flock of which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers. Be shepherds of the Church of God ..."* Acts 20:28. Pray especially regarding decisions made at the recent Church Members' meeting. Uphold our staff and volunteers, together with members of the CLT, as they seek to lead us throughout the coming Christmas season.

THURSDAY *"Stand up in the presence of the aged and show respect for the elderly and revere your God. I am the LORD."* Leviticus 19:32. Give thanks for the work undertaken by those who have a concern for the older members of our church and congregation. Remember especially the many widows (and widowers) in our membership for whom a sense of aloneness can be overwhelming at times. May they always have the assurance of our love and prayers, together with the Lord's abiding help and presence, especially during the long winter evenings.

FRIDAY *"I will turn their mourning into gladness; I will give them comfort and joy instead of sorrow".* Jeremiah 31:15. Several friends have suffered a bereavement in recent times. Pray that they might be assured that their loved ones are with Christ "which is far better." May we continue to be supportive of them throughout their ongoing grief journey, as they adjust to life without their loved ones. SUNDAY *"Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young ... fan into flame the gift of God ..." 1Tim 4:12 and 2Tim 1:6.* Give thanks for our young people who have been studying away from home. Pray for their ongoing education/training and pray also that they will be well grounded in faith, making good, lasting and supportive friendships Continue to uphold all who work with our children and young people week by week - may they know the backing and encouragement of the whole church family, and also have the necessary helpers needed to run their groups efficiently, both on Sundays and in their midweek activities.

VACANCY P/T EVENT MANAGER

Bible by the Beach is a charity which provides an annual, weekend Christian conference based in Eastbourne but focusing on the whole southeast region and beyond. The conference takes place early May each year.

We have an exciting opportunity for an experienced part-time Event Manager to join our small team to help deliver this annual event.

The key responsibilities of this role are-

- **Managing** the whole event in conjunction with BBtB Trustees.
- **Act** as clerk to the Trustees
- **Develop relationships** with local venues, churches and other organisations and draw up contracts for use of.
- **Liaise with heads of departments** (Youth, Children, Speakers, Musicians, Technical etc.) to ensure smooth running of the event.
- **Oversee** all aspects of Publicity and Marketing of the event.
- **Give financial support** to the Charity and the event.

There is a genuine occupational requirement for this role to be filled by a committed Christian who agrees with the Bible by the Beach Statement of Faith.
