Prayer Diary: 27TH October - 2nD November

Monday "To the faithful You show Yourself faithful" Psalm 18:25. The only way to be delivered from surrounding evil is to call on God for help and strength. This is a psalm of praise and thanksgiving, it is a powerful psalm, read it to set yourself up to walk with God this week! And pray that the Ukrainian leadership will depend on our great God to fight their battles and bring peace through faith in Jesus Christ.

Tuesday "this people has rejected the gently flowing waters of Shiloah" Isaiah 8:6 Father God we pray for our nation that has rejected You and as was the case in Isaiah 8 v19 we pray that our witness and Your blessing will stop people from consulting with false gods and enable a change in values, goals and direction of travel in their lives that results in salvation.

Wednesday We thank You for the blessings that the internet has enabled, allowing online church services and "introduction to Christianity" initiatives to reach young people especially, many of whom have never encountered God before. We pray for the spiritual growth of a young generation who come to You, and that You will protect them from false prophets.

Thursday "I saw the Lord, high and exalted, seated on a throne..." Isaiah 6:1 Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty. Read verse 8. Isaiah was willing to go, to be sent by God, even before he knew what God wanted! Reflect on the place where God sends you every day - home, work, shops etc and pray to God that you will reflect His holy character there. Maybe, like Isaiah, pray to God asking Him if He is calling you to something new.

Friday We heard from a speaker from Open Doors recently that many Christians they work with require trauma care to help them recover from abuse and acts of terrorism. Let's pray for just a few of these victims today (please note, all names and situations mentioned are openly available to the public in the Open Doors prayer diary) Father God, we pray for church leaders working in Sudan where the conflict has exacerbated the persecution of believers. We pray that You will bring emotional and spiritual healing from all they have seen in the war.

We pray for pastor Duminda, who has recently received persecution survival training in Sri Lanka, bless his life in your service we pray.

We pray for Rifkatu in Nigeria who was kidnapped 4 weeks after her wedding. Now released, we pray that the trauma care she is receiving will free her from the physical and emotional violence of her captors and from her nightmares.


In Niger, we pray for the Open Doors training programmes training pastors to respond biblically to persecution and equip them to persevere in their call to shepherd God's people,

Saturday Lord, we pray for world-wide church unity. We pray that the new female head of the Church of England will have her ministry blessed by You and that You will show that she is Your choice for the job. We pray that King Charles' decision to spend time praying with the Pope will be blessed by You and enable more unity despite the obvious differences in some theology. And we pray for the new members of the CLT to bring more of Your wisdom so that VBC will go only where You are leading.

Sunday Heavenly Father, we thank You that You have lovingly and carefully planted and cultivated us in our journey of faith as a vine in Your vineyard. As we think now about some of the key people and moments in that journey ... we give You thanks for all You have done, and worship You alone today. Amen

Delight in the Lord

Another in the series of thoughts inspired by quotations from the Book of Psalms. These were put together in a booklet - "Delight in the Lord" - some 30 years ago by Margaret Barham. "The LORD has heard my cry for mercy; the Lord accepts my prayer" Psalm 6:9



When we are unwell and our body is tired and aching, it often affects our spirit and we can feel that God is far away and that He is angry with us or disciplining us in some way. However we feel, we can still tell God about it. We can tell Him about our sickness and ask for His healing. We can tell Him about the anguish of our soul, and that He seems far away and not answering us. We can ask for His help - not because we merit it or deserve it, but because of His unfailing love towards us, which we see most clearly in the sufferings of Jesus and His death on the Cross for us.

No matter how worn out we feel, or how many tears we have shed, whether tears of sadness, or tears of self-pity or

frustration, God still loves us, and we can be sure that He has heard our weeping, and that in His own time He will deliver us.

When we feel that everything is against us and that no-one is on our side, we can still call out to God for help, knowing that He has heard and accepted our prayer and will come to our aid.

Prayer Diary: 3RD - 9TH November

"Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." 1 Thessalonians 5:16-17

Monday Lord, we thank You for always being present to hear our prayers and for the power of prayer, to change lives through the actions of Your Holy Spirit. Father, hear our prayers this coming week as we reach out to You individually, in small groups at home or in our church, and especially as we gather to worship You on Sunday.

Tuesday "He will judge between the nations and will settle disputes for many nations". Isaiah 2:4

Father, we pray for the continuation of the peace process in the Middle East and for negotiations in the Ukraine to begin to bear fruit. We pray for the cessation of hostilities, the repatriation of prisoners, and for families to be reunited. Father, send us Your Son, the Prince of Peace, to silence the guns and allow the process of reconciliation to begin.

Wednesday Heavenly Father, we pray for Your protection over those gathering to watch firework displays on this Bonfire Night. Pray for safety protocols to be observed and for the potential dangers of fireworks to be recognised especially by children.

Thursday Loving Father, we lift up to You all those experiencing loneliness, especially as the nights draw in. This autumnal time of year is so difficult for many as the reduced daylight hours mean there is less social contact. Lord, put it upon our hearts to reach out to someone we know who is living alone, be it with a telephone call or a short visit, always remembering we are doing this in Jesus' name. He was a friend to everyone.

Friday Dear Lord, we lift up to You those who have recently been baptised. We thank You for the miracle of spiritual rebirth and the transformation that has taken place in their lives. May they continually experience the power of the Holy Spirit, to obey your Word and resist sin. Grant them, Lord, a spirit of humility, wisdom and resilience to continue the purpose you have planned for their lives. Lord, equip us to encourage and guide them in their times of need, to continue to declare You as their Lord and Saviour.

Saturday "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in ." Matthew 25:35 The UN World Food Programme says that 40% less funding this year will mean famine for 14 million people in Afghanistan, DRC, Somalia South Sudan and many other countries.

Father, we pray for Your intervention to change the hearts of our world leaders and restore the funding to the famine relief programs. Pray for adequate resourcing for the aid organisations so they can act in famine suffering areas, and for successful harvests in these war torn, drought afflicted countries. Dear Lord, have mercy on those in such desperate need.

Sunday Heavenly Father, as we come before You this morning, seeking renewal in body and spirit, we pray for You to fill us with your peace and help us to let go of any burdens weighing us down. Father, as we worship You in song and praise, may your Holy Spirit wash over us, renewing and refreshing our souls. As we leave the service, may we be filled with the joy of knowing we are fully anointed servants of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Risen King.

An International Day of Prayer (IDOP) event with Andrew Brunson Wednesday 19th November at Holy Trinity Church, Eastbourne at 7.30pm



For 23 years, Andrew and his wife Norine served as missionaries in Turkey. In October 2016, they hit headlines around the world when they were arrested and falsely accused of terrorism. For the next two years, Andrew was held in Turkish prisons. Following a worldwide prayer movement, he was dramatically released in October 2018.

At this event, Andrew will share his compelling story with us, encourage us to remember those who remain in prison for their faith, and challenge us to consider how ready we are to face opposition for Jesus.
