


Core Leapership Team



Delight in the Lord

Another in the series of thoughts inspired by quotations from the Book of Psalms. These were put together in a booklet - "Delight in the Lord" - some 30 years ago by Margaret Barham, pictured here.





"The LORD has heard my cry for mercy; the Lord accepts my prayer" Psalm 6:9

When we are unwell and our body is tired and aching, it often affects our spirit and we can feel that God is far away and that He is angry with us or disciplining us in some way. However we feel, we can still tell God about it. We can tell Him about our sickness and ask for His healing. We can tell Him about the anguish of our soul, and that He seems far away and not answering us. We can ask for His help - not because we merit it or deserve it, but because of His unfailing love towards us, which we see most clearly in the sufferings of Jesus and His death on the Cross for us.

No matter how worn out we feel, or how many tears we have shed, whether tears of sadness,

or tears of self-pity or frustration, God still loves us, and we can be sure that He has heard our weeping, and that in His own time He will deliver us.

When we feel that everything is against us and that no-one is on our side, we can still call out to God for help, knowing that He has heard and accepted our prayer and will come to our aid.



Job Vacancy ...

... for a salaried frontline chaplains' role with the **Beachy Head Chaplaincy Team.**

The role involves working flexible shift patterns from 09:00 to 24:00 with shifts being 5 or 10 hours in length. Our service operates 365 days per year.


If you are not able to come to Flow Café, you can drop your contributions into the office in the week leading up to the Harvest weekend.
