

"He Himself bore our sins in His body on the tree, that we might die to sins and live for righteousness: "by His wounds you were healed." (1Peter 2:24-25)

Creative Writing


Our next meeting is on Sat 13th April, 10.30-noon in the usual venue, the Hive. The subject for the meeting, and your homework in advance of the meeting, is:

Praying in the Spirit¹

As we continue with our Sunday series about the Holy Spirit, it is worth considering His influence on our prayer life. This is one of the main differences when a person becomes a Christian; they start to really pray. Paul, before his conversion as a strict Pharisee, prayed often but it was ineffective as he was still far from God. After his conversion though, on the road to Damascus, what was his first action but to be found 'praying' (Acts 9:11) and I am sure it was unlike any prayer he had uttered previously. In the following account I

would like to touch on what that new Spirit-filled prayer life is like, what to aim for, and its characteristics.

Firstly, its importance is supported by Jesus' own example of repeated prayer times and His teaching, summarised by his exhortation 'that men ought always to pray and not lose heart' (Lk. 18:1) and by the writers of the epistles, that we should 'pray at all times in the Spirit with all prayer and supplication.' Eph 6:18 as well as 'devote ourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful' (Col.4:2).

Secondly, we are reminded in scripture and from our own experience that true prayer is not easy and we are ignorant of the right way to pray. The disciples of Jesus and the disciples of John the Baptist realised this and asked them to teach them how to pray (Lk.11:1. They obliged, most notably in the Lord's prayer and, to the early Christians, through the writing of the epistles.

Thirdly, the New Testament speaks of the need for our prayers to be Spirit-led to be effective eg Eph 6:18, 'Pray at all times in the Spirit with all prayer and supplication' or Jude v20, 'building yourselves up in your most holy faith and praying in the Holy Spirit.' That leads us to ask, 'How do I get my prayers to be 'in the Spirit?' Psalm 10:17 gives us a clue, 'O Lord You hear the desire of the afflicted, You encourage/

prepare **their heart**, and You listen to their cry.'

We are reminded here that it is God who 'prepares' our hearts and prompts us to pray and, as we act on that leading, He responds. An example of this is Daniel when he realised from the prophecy of Jeremiah that after seventy years of exile God promised to bring back His people to their homeland, so he prayed accordingly (Daniel 9). As James reminds us, 'The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective' (Ja. 5:16).



.... That leads us to ask, how can we enjoy such a prayer life? Do we just wait for the Spirit's prompting before we pray? No, the Bible teaches it is our duty to pray (Lk18:1) and it is as we do so that we put ourselves in a position where God can lead us. I am reminded of what Peter Boehler, the Moravian missionary to England, told the Reverend John Wesley when the latter confessed he lacked a living faith and wanted to give up preaching. Boehler advised, 'Preach faith till you have it; and then, because you have it, you will preach faith.' It is the same with Spirit-filled prayer; let us continue until we enter into its fullness.

What does Spirit-filled prayer look like, so it is not just mechanical? The Bible gives us the following characteristics:

- 1. A humbling realisation we are in the presence of a Holy and Almighty God (Ps 24:3-4, Heb. 12:28-29)
- 2. A sense of privilege, that we can enter God's presence through the blood of Christ (Rom. 5:1-2, Eph 2.18).
- 3. A boldness and assurance. Despite God's holiness, because of Christ's sacrifice and His intercession for us as High Priest, we have **confidence** to 'draw near to God's throne...to receive mercy and find grace to help us in our need'. (Heb.4:14-16 & 10:19-22).
- 4. A freedom and lively spirit where you are not self conscious and words come naturally as between close friends or children crying to their 'Abba Father' (Rom. 8:15).
- 5. A **passion, energy and warmth** that touches the heart as well as the mind fulfilling John the Baptist's words, 'He (Jesus) will baptise you with the Holy spirit and **fire**'. Further experienced by the early believers in Acts 4:31, 'After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly.'
- 6. **Thanksgiving and love**, even in difficult circumstances. For example, Paul and Silas 'praying and singing' in the Philippian prison and Paul's letter to the Philippi Christians from another jail when he exhorts them, 'Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and petition with thanksgiving present your requests to God.' (Phil.4:6).
- 7. **Persistence**, realising how essential prayer is to the Christian cause. We read, Epaphras 'is always wrestling in prayer' for the Colossian believers (Col.4:12) while Paul urges Roman Christians, 'to join me in my struggle by praying to God for me.'(Rom.15:30)

What a great resource Spirit-filled prayer is to help Christians and the church. Let us strive to enjoy more of it and so bring heaven a little closer to earth.

Prayer Diary 1st -7th April

"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ." Eph 1:3

Monday "And, you also were included in Christ when you heard the message of truth, the gospel of your salvation. When you believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit" Eph 1:13

Thank God for those who were baptised yesterday and a few weeks ago. Pray they may grow stronger in their faith daily, rooted and grounded in Christ. Pray that they may know the victory of Christ in the struggles they encounter as 'greater is He who is in them than in the world.' Pray for the Omega Group for 18–35-year-olds.

Tuesday "I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit[all of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know Him better. I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which He has called you, the riches of His glorious inheritance in His holy people" Eph 1:17-18

Pray that we as a church may fully grasp the hope we have and all that Jesus achieved for us when He died, rose again, ascended into heaven, and press on to take hold of that for which Jesus took hold of us. Pray for Chris Short as he teaches, and for Erik and Simon as they prepare the children and young people. Pray for Jez as he leads the Bible Academy. Pray for the life Groups that they may be places where we grow together in our relationship with God and others.

Wednesday "Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time because the days are evil" Eph 5:15,16

Pray that we may honour God in our family life, at work and in all we do each day so that we can be salt and light in our community. Pray for organisations that seek to help those in need, such as Foodbank, Street Pastors, Matthew 25, The Sanctuary, Living Life and People Matter.

Thursday "For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms." *Eph 6:12*

When we look around us and see rulers of the world seeking to do their will, destroying many innocent people, it is good to know that God is sovereign. Pray that His Kingdom will come and His will be done on earth. Pray for peace between Ukraine and Russia; Pray for peace in Israel and Gaza. Pray for justice for those who are vulnerable, those who have had to flee war and persecution.

"And pray in the Spirit on all occasions, with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people. Pray also for me, that whenever I speak, words may be given me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it fearlessly, as I should" Eph 6:17-20 Pray for the outreach activities at VBC - CAP, the Community Fridge, and Alpha, so that those who come may experience God's love in those who help them. Pray, too, for those who come to church through NetworX contacts. Pray for the next Alpha Course, which is coming up in April.

"I pray that out of His glorious riches, He may strengthen you with Saturday power through His Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge - that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God." Eph 3:16-18

Pray for the VBC Holy Spirit Day today, giving us space to go deeper with God and pray for one another. Pray for wisdom and guidance for those leading and organising the event. Pray it will be a great day of joy and refreshing in God's presence as we seek Him together.

Sunday "Do not get drunk on wine, which leads to debauchery. Instead, be filled with the Spirit, speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit. Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord." Eph 5:18-20

May our worship of God be in Spirit and truth. Spend some time today worshipping God, singing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs; thank Him that we are free to worship, remembering those in countries where they can only worship secretly or risk being arrested if they meet together.
