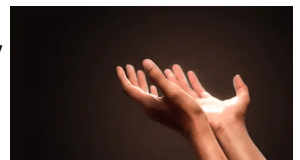

Eastbourne CRC Finds New Purpose



Since 1949 there has been a Christian Resource Centre operating from 91-93 Seaside. The sale of Christian Books, Bibles and other resources flourished through many turbulent times. However in recent years it has become increasingly more difficult to sustain a retail operation. **The Eastbourne Christian Resource Centre will continue retail operations through the Christmas period and into January before finally closing its doors on 31st January 2022.**

However, a plan has been agreed with Kingdom Way Trust (KWT) to ensure that the furtherance of the Christian Gospel and advancement of the Christian faith in this part of town continues into the future. KWT indicated that they were looking for a suitable premises as a weekend drop-in venue for homeless and vulnerable people in the town. In addition, KWT needed additional space for private appointments; collaborative work with other agencies; support and recovery groups; Alpha Courses; a meeting place and hub for the benefit of those they work with. And so the CRC Trustees have agreed in principle to pass the freehold of the property onto KWT, subject to Charity Commission approval.

A sad end to over 70 years of the Christian Bookshop, as it used to be called, with VBC having had close links with it through the work of Henry & Joyce Kirkman running the book stall here. But a positive step in the CRC Trustees passing over the premises to KWT to use the premises for their own outreach purposes.

My precious delight, never out of my sight,

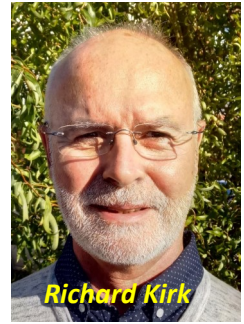
No more wrong, just do right, come into the light."

MIRACLES OF JESUS

A Very Private Miracle – MARK 1:29 – 31

“And immediately, when they had come out of the synagogue, they went along with Peter, James and John into the house of Simon and Andrew. Peter’s mother-in-law was in bed with an attack of fever.”

They spoke to Jesus about her. He went up to her, took her hand and raised her up. The fever left her and she began to serve them.

Following the synagogue service, Jesus and three of His disciples made their way to Peter’s home in Capernaum, maybe to enjoy a Sabbath lunch. They find Peter’s mother-in-law bedridden with a fever. (Luke 4 : 38 “a high fever.”)

According to Jewish custom, the main Sabbath meal came immediately after the synagogue service at the sixth hour, that is, 12 o’clock midday. Jesus could well have wanted to rest after the exhausting synagogue service. His power was appealed to and He spent Himself for others.

This event tells us something about Jesus. He did not require an audience to exert His power. He was prepared to heal in a little cottage, as in the great crowd in the synagogue – never too tired to help – the needs of others always took precedence over His desire for rest.

Jesus had unique methods of healing. There were many exorcists in the time of Jesus. They worked with elaborate incantations and spells. In the synagogue, Jesus had spoken and the healing was complete.

This miracle tells us something about the disciples. They had not known Jesus very long, but they shared all their troubles with the Master. “I must tell Jesus!”

There is a lesson for each one of us today. We can share our joys and our sadnesses, our hopes and fears. The hymn, “Take it to the Lord in prayer” is so true.

What about the star of the story, Peter’s wife’s mother? She had been healed so she began to serve others. In today’s culture, the kettle was on the boil. Jesus helps us as we help others. Word had already spread about the events in the synagogue – now another miracle – Peter’s mother-in-law.

Mark just says, “Jesus healed many who were sick with various diseases and cast our many demons.” (v 34) What a remarkable day it had been! In just twelve hours, Jesus had revealed His sovereign authority as demonic powers had been quelled and the sick made well. ...

... But the episode next morning helps us to understand Jesus' priorities. He had taken refuge in a remote place to spend time with His Father in prayer.

When Peter and his fellow disciples found Jesus, they were bursting with excitement (v 37). "Everyone is looking for you" but what about Jesus' response? (v 38) "Let us go on to the next town, that I may preach there also for that is why I have come."

Towards the conclusion of Queen Elizabeth's Coronation, the Archbishop of Canterbury turns to the representatives of many countries and asks, "I present to you, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, your undoubted sovereign. Will you pay her homage?"



The events described in Mark 1 presents our undisputed sovereign Lord, King of Kings. "Will you pay Him homage?"
