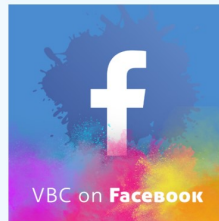

## **Luke 17:1-10 – The Essential Jesus – The Peace Process**

**“Even if they sin against you seven times in a day and seven times come back to you saying, “I repent”, you must forgive them.” (Luke 17:1-10)**

What are we to do about the problems in the world? What are we to say when people talk about the troubles in the Ukraine or in Israel? Is there any way we can tilt this sinful, troubled world towards heaven and away from hell? Can we make a difference? What should Jewish and Palestinian Israelis do? What should we do?



In the passage we’re looking at this week, Jesus gives us the answer. The world needs people who intentionally, perpetually, and sacrificially forgive others. That’s the only way that minor offences are stopped from becoming major ones. It’s the only way that minor conflicts are prevented from becoming all-out wars. It’s the only way both victims and perpetrators can avoid complete ruin. That’s as true in homes and workplaces as it is among nations.

But where on earth are we to find such people? When the disciples understood Jesus’ command, it seemed impossible to them. Jesus, replied that it was not only perfectly possible but it was also their most basic duty. In doing so He gave them the key. God willing, this Sunday, we’ll discover it together.

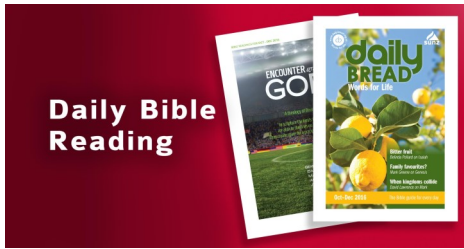

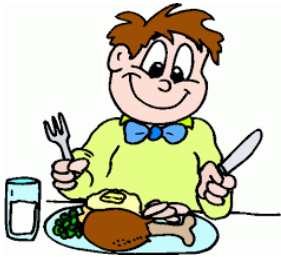

## NOTES FROM BULGARIA

*You will recall that Brian Wightwick is currently in Bulgaria. He sent us an update earlier this week, giving an outline of his activities.*

Sunday morning (29<sup>th</sup> Oct) - preached at Full Gospel Church in Sofia. Smallish congregation of around 50, yet they have supplied 50,000 meals to Ukrainians already this year! Very dynamic church, led by a friend of mine.

Then to Kazanlak on Sunday afternoon (3+ hour by car)

Preached this evening (Tues 31<sup>st</sup>) at the Evangelical Church, where we were based as a mission team last year. This was a midweek service and I based it on the study we did at our VBC Life Group last Wednesday (25<sup>th</sup>) from Philippians 4:6-7.



Tomorrow (Wed 1<sup>st</sup>) visiting the old folks' home with selection of items collected and using surplus cash from last year to provide some extras for the 60 or so older people, none of whom have close family any longer

Sunday (5<sup>th</sup>) morning is another preaching slot at the Evangelical Church and next Wednesday evening a Bible Study at the Baptist Church.

Value your prayers especially for Sunday as they expect a full-length sermon! Pray that one of their very good interpreters will be available - they can usually translate simultaneously as we have worked together many times before.



In the next few weeks 400+ migrants will be leaving the hotels in Eastbourne for an unknown destination. This could be the streets of Eastbourne or somewhere else. They quite literally do not know where they are going. Amongst them are children as part of families. Many arrived with nothing and gradually they have accumulated some clothes and books and so they need suitcases.

Two hotels will close on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> November, the others in a fortnight, we believe. So please, as a matter of urgency, please let us have any suitcases you may have which you feel may now be redundant. They can be brought to the office and I can collect them from there.

## CREATIVE WRITING: 'ROLL UP, READ ALL ABOUT IT!'



Since retiring I have had more time to buy and read a newspaper and see if it has advantages over reading other freely available news online which I was used to when working.

My conclusion so far is yes, it has. I like the feel of the paper, easy accessibility of different articles that I can annotate, and I have been reminded what good journalism and writing there is amongst our broadsheets, especially the well-researched topics relating to current issues, or the variety and engaging writing of others covered. For example, the paper I picked up last week covered - the luxury Intercontinental Hotel in Kabul under Taliban and non-Taliban management; why Ultra processed foods are so addictive; and an analysis of why the same people are often late for things - all fascinating reading.

**This gave me the idea that the next Creative Writing topic is to write an article on a subject that interests you and make it interesting for a wider audience who have little knowledge of the topic, not more than 600 words, in line with space restrictions of a newspaper. It can be in the form of a poem if you prefer.**

## PRAYER DIARY 6<sup>TH</sup> - 12<sup>TH</sup> November

Based on Psalm 105

**Monday (v1)** "Praise the Lord. Praise the name of the Lord; praise Him, you servants of the Lord". The names in Bible times were often chosen to show the character of the person named. For example, we know God as our Heavenly Father (Abba); our Holy God who cannot look on sin; the Lord Jesus, our Saviour; and the Holy Spirit, who is the "Paraclete", meaning the One who is alongside us, as well as within us.

So, today, think about how well you know Him, and praise Him for every aspect of His Name that is important to you. Pray that God would reveal more of Himself and His attributes to you.

**Tuesday (v2)** "Praise the name of the Lord you who minister in the house of the LORD, in the courts of the house of our God." Let us pray for all those who teach adults, our young people or children, and those who work in the offices and care for the building. Let us ask that they too might grow in their knowledge of the Lord and ALL His names and character.

**Wednesday (v3)** "Praise the Lord, for the Lord is good; sing praise to His name, for that is pleasant." Let us praise Him for all that we know of His goodness in our own lives and families, in our church life, and the many activities that reach out to others at Victoria. Sing, or make a joyful noise to Him today - maybe using a recording of worship songs to give Him praise.

**Thursday** Pray for the protection of all those Jews and Arabs in Israel and Gaza who believe in Jesus. Remember the hostages in prayer, praying for their protection and release. Pray especially, that God will give visions and dreams or other revelations of Himself to all people on either side who cry out to Him for help in this war situation.

**Friday (vv8-9)** "He remembers His covenant for ever, the promise He made, for a thousand generations, the covenant He made with Abraham, the oath He swore to Isaac." Let us continue in prayer for those at war. In Ukraine, many hostages have been Christians whose families are desperate for news of them. Children have been traumatized by rockets and constant sirens, the loss of family members, homes and possessions. Please just cry out to God for them, ask Him to watch over them and to keep safe our link Church family in Lebedyn, and all those who work or volunteer there.

**FUEL FOR PRAYER**

**Saturday (vv42-43)** “For He remembered His holy promise given to His servant Abraham. He brought out His people with rejoicing, His chosen ones with shouts of joy.” As wars, and rumours of wars, continue in this present age, let us give thanks to God for the Lord Jesus who redeems and rescues a people that are His very own – God’s true and treasured possession (1Pet. 2:9-10). Let us pray that many come into the joy and life that are found in Him alone.

**Sunday (vv13-14)** “Your name, Lord, endures for ever, Your renown, Lord, through all generations. For the Lord will vindicate His people and have compassion on His servants.” There is so much in the Bible that shows us how true this is. Many of us have seen the Lord vindicate us or show His compassion to us, and can testify that our Heavenly Father has proved faithful in supporting us and bringing us safely through many difficult life situations.

Please spend time worshipping our God who is truth, faithful to His Covenants and promises, loving, gracious, and full of compassion for each of His children.

Remember too, the service at Victoria, the youth work, and Erik in India, plus those in Sunday School. May they all experience, or learn about, the names and faithfulness of our Heavenly Father.
