James 5:7-11 – Be Patient "Be patient and stand firm, because the Lord's coming is near." (James 5:7-11)

Have you ever wondered why, when we visit the doctor or are admitted to hospital, we are referred to as 'the patient'? It's to do with suffering. The Latin root of the word patient (pati) means 'to suffer' or 'to endure'. A patient is one who suffers with an illness and endures treatment. Before the days of anaesthetic, the latter was often as unpleasant as the former!



When James tells us to 'be patient', he's not talking about the kind of patience we need as we wait for the WiFi to connect, or when we're sitting in traffic, or waiting in line for the next customer service representative to answer our call. He's talking about enduring the very real and painful hardships of the Christian life — whether it be unjust treatment, unanswered prayer or unfulfilled expectations.

Patience is one of the hardest things God asks of us. It is painful, it requires power, and it comes with a promise. These are the things we'll consider together as we conclude our series 'A Swarm of Vicky Bees'.


Faithful God, thank You that Your love is steadfast and unconditional. Thank You for all Your promises that assure us that You will not let go of us and that we will be with You for eternity.

BOOK Review of 'Dominion' by Tom Holland

We have heard recently of the spiritual 'Quiet Revival' occurring in UK churches. There has also been a 'quiet revival' in the last fifty years among academics reassessing the pivotal role Christianity has played in producing liberal ideas such as human rights, equality of individuals, self worth, advancement and benefit of science and segregation of church and state. Tom Holland, as an astute historian, is one of them, taking a look at the last 2,500 years to show the unique Christian influence on the development of the western mind in his book 'Dominion'.


The book is erudite, well researched, with an engaging, developing story line with thematic chapters capturing the dominant mood of the period surveyed eg Mission, Charity, Revolution, Reformation, Science, Love etc. It is peppered with fascinating details, characters and narrative showing how Christian beliefs, centred on one obscure, cruelly crucified man, had such a profound effect on thought and practice in western society and beyond. Even amongst those who turned their back on Christianity and religion, he demonstrates how they were still influenced by its teaching. Referring often to Nietsche, he repeats the philosopher's observation that, even when people try to get rid of God, they and their teachings still remain in Christianity's 'shadow' and can't quite shake its influence off. On the other hand, he does not let Christianity completely off the hook, exposing its many failures in history as well.

Though Tom Holland shows this welcome respect for Christianity, influenced by his fresh appraisal of history and, as he admits, by having a devout Christian godmother, who served as a positive role model, he doesn't profess a personal faith. In fact, at the end of his book he downplays Christianity as 'a story told by a species that could not bear very much reality.'

This is sad to read of someone who has carefully sifted the historical records to discern the reality of Christian influence on the western mind but still fails to see its validity. The evidence for a personal belief in Jesus Christ is based on real historical evidence that goes beyond just the symbolism of the cross Holland often alludes to. Jesus, the Son of God, became a real man, experienced real suffering and, most convincingly of all, rose from the dead, all of which was witnessed to and recorded for people to have a sure foundation for a personal belief. It does not get more real than that!


"Ask of Me and I will make the nations your inheritance, the ends of the earth your possession"
