Matthew 19:27 - 20:19 The Essential Jesus Gratitude and Grumbling

Jesus' stories don't make sense. They invite us to see the world in a way we are not used to seeing it. That makes Jesus' stories powerfully subversive. He turns the values of the world upside down.

In the story about the workers in the vineyard we know where our sympathies lie. Many of us sympathise with the workers who have worked all day but were only paid the same as those who worked for an hour.

What is that about? Jesus tells us it's about the Kingdom of God. If we don't understand this story we're missing important truths about the Kingdom and its King. The



truth about Him is that He will do as He pleases in His own Kingdom and what pleases Him is to give grace to the undeserving.

It's only when we recognise that as good news for us that it turns our grumbling into gratitude.

Session 8 - Rabbi Jesus' Teaching Methods

Understanding Jesus' Jewishness is crucial when seeking a deeper understanding of His teaching. Considered to be a rabbi by followers and opponents alike, Jesus used teaching methods similar to those of other rabbis but took them to a higher level. Methods such as 'light to heavy', hyperbole and 'Scripture connections' had a big impact upon His audience.

Pop into our shop for a coffee (the old TJ Hughes building) and find out more. For now, **Hvala** (thank you in Croatian) from the children and their families.





LIVING BY FAITH

Encouraging lessons when facing trials - from the Book of Habakkuk

After nineteen months of ongoing warfare since Russia invaded Ukraine, with little

prospect of the war ending (it is even intensifying), there is the temptation to lose heart and ask the questions - Does God care? Why does He allow the wicked to triumph and not punish them? These are questions Godly people in the Bible like Job, David, Jeremiah and the man who wrote Psalm 73 asked, but there is one in particular who most closely fits the Ukrainian/Russian situation and that is the prophet Habakkuk whose message has most to encourage us and our brethren in Lebedyn.



Habakkuk lived at the time when the Babylonian

Empire was in the ascendancy and had invaded Judah, destroying its cities, and was about to destroy Jerusalem and take its people captive (597-6BC). It was a proud, pagan and cruel power, yet God had declared He was using them to punish Israel for disobeying Him and turning to other gods.

In the light of this, Habakkuk, one of God's chosen prophets, was in distress and struggled to understand God's working. He laid out his dilemma and complaint to God in three main areas:

The success of the wicked while the righteous suffer Ch.1:2-4

How could a Holy God use a wicked nation as part of His purpose? Ch. 1:12-17

God's silence and inactivity while evil triumphs Ch. 1:13

To start, it's worth pondering Habakkuk's daring to complain to God, but the latter does not condemn him nor other believers who have honest questions. May this encourage us to take our difficulties to the Lord in prayer and, like Habakkuk, wait for His answer. God promises to do so and it will enrich our understanding and faith in Him.

How did God answer Habakkuk and give him something to hold onto? He tells us God gave him an 'oracle' or revelation (Ch. 1:1) and part of that was a prayer/song/psalm that was for congregational use and instruction in the temple worship (Ch.3:1 & 19). As all scripture is for our benefit (2 Tim. 3:16) its message has relevance for us also. So what lessons does this book have for us and our brethren in Lebedyn?

Firstly, it reminds us that it is not unusual to be fearful or distressed by difficult situations. Godly people such as David, Job, Jeremiah, Elijah, John the Baptist, even the mighty apostle Paul knew 'weakness and fear' (1Cor2:3). Habakkuk experienced this also (Ch.1:2) and at God's message he shook like a leaf (Ch 3:16) but like other godly people it did not stop God using him and them. God is gracious and 'a bruised reed he will not break' but repair and strengthen it for His service.

Secondly, God reminded Habakkuk in chapter two that He is a sovereign and holy God,

'But the Lord is in His holy temple, let all the earth be silent before Him' (v20), and He will judge the wicked nations in His time, not ours, with their downfall; the

Babylonian Empire fell to the Persians in 539! Our job as believers is to be patient and faithful, trusting God, who as 'the Judge of all the earth will do right' Gen. 18:25. As the Lord reminded Habakkuk in answer to his complaint, 'For the revelation awaits an appointed time....Though it linger, wait for it: it will certainly come and will not delay.......but the righteous will live by his faith.' Ch. 2:3-4. Something Habakkuk was able to do,



with God's help, in those memorable verses at the end, 'Though the fig tree does not bud etc....yet I will rejoice in the Lord', Ch.3:16-19.

Thirdly, Habakkuk looks back in chapter three at what God has miraculously and mercifully done in Israel's history to deliver them from the oppressive Egyptians to give Habakkuk and the Jews hope for their present predicament. 'Lord, I have heard of Your fame: I stand in awe of Your deeds, O Lord. Renew them in our day...in wrath remember mercy' Ch. 3:2.

Fourthly, as we see Habakkuk's message through New Testament eyes, we can look back at what God has done through the even mightier works of His son, Jesus Christ - His miracles, teaching, substitutionary death on the cross, resurrection, ascension and pouring out of his Holy Spirit - to show His love for us. In addition, we have the greater prophecy in the Book of Revelation given to the Apostle John reminding us that God will, at the final judgement, destroy and judge all ungodly, worldly powers represented by 'Babylon', see Revelation Ch. 18.

Let us therefore, like Habakkuk, when circumstances go against us and we are bewildered, come to that calm state of peaceful perseverance and rejoicing in an almighty God, our Saviour, and find strength to carry on,

We have an exciting opportunity for an experienced part-time Operations Manager to join our small team to help deliver this annual event.

The key responsibilities of this role are-

- Managing the whole event in conjunction with BBtB Trustees
- Act as clerk to the Trustees
- Develop relationships with local venues, churches and other organisations and draw up contracts for use of.
- Liaise with heads of departments (Youth, Children, Speakers, Musicians, Technical etc.) to ensure smooth running of the event.
- Oversee all aspects of Publicity and Marketing of the event.
- · Give financial support to the Charity and the event.

Our ideal candidate will have:

- exceptional organisational and interpersonal skills
- · excellent communication and IT skills
- ability to liaise with venues and help draw up contracts
- able to work under pressure and make good decisions

Linking Lives Eastbourne

Loneliness! Most of us experienced it in one way or another during the Covid lockdown years and many have been able to pick up their lives again — albeit with some impact perhaps on a sense of wellbeing or confidence. But can you imagine the pain of constant loneliness?

We are so blessed to be part of a vibrant Church family here at Victoria, so that even when/if we feel lonely, we know that there are so many sources of support and friendship to tap in to. Sadly, for far too many people, there are no such sources available to them.



In November 2022, I was reading the VBC Newsletter (Yes, I do read it! And I recommend it!) and I came across a very small article looking for a Coordinator to join the Linking Lives Eastbourne (LLE) team. At first I was just delighted to see that LLE had survived the lockdown. Back in 2016, when I was Chief Executive at Eastbourne Blind Society, I had been part of an early stakeholder group looking at ways to address loneliness in Eastbourne. Little did I know then how God would direct me back to it through this small article. It says in Jeremiah 29:11, "For I know the plans I have for you...plans to give you a hope and a future". It became clear to me that God's plan was for me to become involved with this lovely Christian charity, and, in January 2023, I joined the team as Scheme Coordinator.

The following is taken from a Newsletter written by our Project Leader, Dr Mary Northway, to St Johns Church in 2020. It seemed to me to encapsulate the impact that the church can make, so I felt I should include part of it here -

The church responded to local need with God's gracious abundance.

And we grew... Our prayer is that we will continue to grow and continue to live out a reflection of a God who delights in kindness. "I am the LORD, who exercises kindness, justice and righteousness on earth, for in these I delight." (Jeremiah 9:24)

At this point it might be helpful to say a bit more about LLE.

Linking Lives Eastbourne is an independent Christian befriending scheme, affiliated to Linking Lives UK. We aim to connect volunteers from local churches with older people in our local community who are isolated or lonely. Our aim is to show kindness, love and inclusion to those who, for various reasons, experience a loss of connection with others. Loneliness doesn't discriminate.

It arrives, unsolicited, through a wide range of reasons. We believe in the power of friendship in being able to reach and support people experiencing loneliness, whether short term or long term.

- "I'm at a loose end all of the time. I usually worry about everything. And now the isolation on top of this is really crushing. And it's frightening." (Link Friend,)
- "She deserves a medal! I know I'm not easy to talk to, but she is so lovely. I
 needed someone positive around me at the moment, and her calls are just
 what I need. Thank you!" (Link Friend)
- "She is worth more than gold or diamonds" (Link Friend)
- "She makes me laugh!"(Volunteer)

It is great that there are some volunteers from our VBC church family, but it would be wonderful to see more. I'm aware that there are many, many needs and requests for your time, but if you felt able to give an hour a week (or every second week) as a volunteer I can guarantee that you could change a life (it might even be your own!)
